### Ruddington village

**Burger night is every Thursday** from 5pm offering home-made burgers such as Minted Lamb, Beef & Chorizo, Breakers' Burger (DBL burger topped with chilli & cheese!), Ultimate Veggie, and Hunters Chicken. Prices start from £8 and all include an alcoholic or soft drink. Meat is sourced from Owen Taylors Butchers of Leabrooks ([www.owentaylor.co.uk](http://www.owentaylor.co.uk)) and all veg & salad is sourced locally from the Ruddington green grocers.

### Sunday Ciabattas

Lamb & Mint, Pork & Apple, or Chicken & Cranberry are served with stuffing, roast potatoes & gravy dip (£5.95). A dessert can be added for just £2.50.

Daily food specials which are always changing have recently included Nachos; Mexican Chicken Wraps; Tuna Steak Salad; and Ham, Egg & Chips.

We are looking at how we can expand the kitchen to improve/renew our food menu. We always try to source our meat locally and may include menu options such as beer-infused sausages and hand-made burgers from C.Brampton Butchers, Melton Road, West Bridgford ([www.cbramptonbutchers.co.uk/west-bridgford-store](http://www.cbramptonbutchers.co.uk/west-bridgford-store))

Our cider range has changed with the Bottle Kicking Cider Company providing our bottles of choice. Thirsty Farmer and Broadoak are our real ciders available on our new cider wall (it's actually a four-foot T-bar, but we are not going to be out-done by the 'Breakers, are we?').

We are looking forward to the return of the students at the end of September with our annual open day for the Real Ale Societies in October.

Following the excellent gig with the Boot Hill Toe-tappers in July, live music continues this month. On August 20th Wholesome Fish (shown below) entertain

from 5pm and the ever reliable Steve entertains with his *Bit of the Blues* on the last Sunday of the month.



Finally, the Plough is phasing in a new fairer discount policy. During September, Mel is changing the present CAMRA discount, for a **LOYALTY card scheme**. The loyalty card is open to everyone with **5%** discount on all wet products, not just the real ales. Plus **10%** on food and snacks. This will come into force on Monday 2nd October, so pop your head around the Plough pub door and see Mel for an application form. Cards will be issued a week later.

Persons enrolling in the new scheme will also have the option of receiving monthly updates, plus an electronic version of the *Mash Tun*, the Nottingham Brewery magazine.

This event is open to all.

Dipping our toe in the water for brewing a strong IPA (5.7%) has been a tremendous success and the craft version has had fantastic feedback. Unfortunately, this is more than can be said of our venture into bottling on a short run of Supreme that we did last Christmas. We out-sourced to a bottling plant closer to home than our ever-dependent Holdens Brewery, who bottle our much acclaimed EPA. This new company messed up big time. Hence we had recall over 30% of the beer as we were so disappointed with the quality, and the bottles towards the end of the run were unrecognizable as Supreme! It will be a while before we try that again. I hate pouring beer away!

If you are travelling nationwide over the next few months, look out for Roses Oatmeal Stout – Sooty under a different name. It is on the JDW national listing and they couldn't use the name Sooty for political correctness reasons, but rest assured that Roses was an original recipe brewed in the 1800s. With our pubs geared up for what we hope will be the rest of a supreme summer (no pun intended), what better way to enjoy the warmer times than with a cool pint of Nottingham Ale down at the PUB! ...Cheers!!

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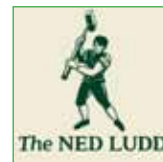
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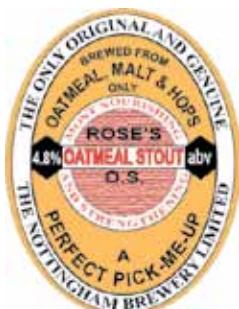
